Degree Partnership Program (DPP)



Students can be jointly admitted and enrolled at Oregon State University and any community college partner.

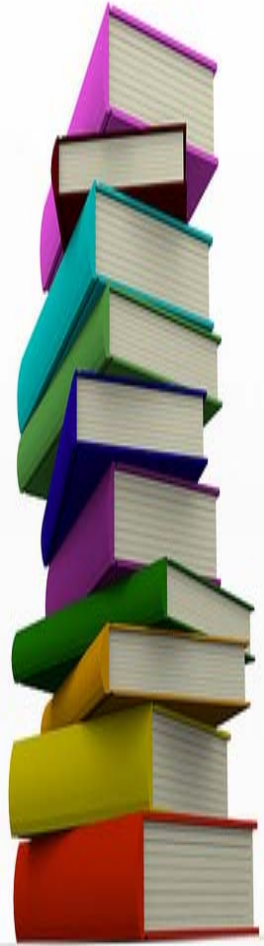


DPP Purpose/Goals

- Improve student access, success and baccalaureate degree completion
- Expand options for college-level services and curriculum
- Improve academic program articulation
- Establish new levels of cooperation
- Joint admission / concurrent enrollment
- Alleviate problems associated with the traditional transfer process
- Remove barriers to persistence, completion
- Reduce the cost and time required to complete a baccalaureate degree
- Develop new academic and career pathways that meet workforce demands



Theory and DPP



- College Students Adjustment and Transition Theory
- Integration has three distinct stages, separation, transition, and incorporation (Tinto)
- Students cope with change in three phases (moving in, moving through, or moving out).
- Adjustment is based on: situation, self, support, and coping strategies (Schlossberg)
- Student Involvement Theory – Energy into the educational setting (Astin)



Transfer DPP Student Benefits



- One application (\$60)
- Transcripts to OSU each term
- OSU course access
- Financial aid counts enrollment at both campuses
- Cost effective

- Declare a major NOW, locked into requirements after first class
- Regular OSU advising early on in academic career
- Access to resources for transition: family housing waiting list, child care waiting list, departmental scholarship applications, and more!
- OSU resources: Academic coaching, Writing Center, Mole Hole, and more (if not in person, than digitally)

Current OSU Student Benefits

- No application fee
- Scheduling flexibility
- Increased course access (Ecampus)
- Financial aid for overall enrollment
- Transcripts to OSU each term
- Access to both campus resources: advising, scholarships, tutoring, etc.
- Smaller class sizes
- Lower costs: resident & non-resident



First Year DPP Admission Reqs.

- High school **GPA** of 3.0 or higher on a standard unweighted 4 point scale
- Official Scholastic Aptitude Test (**SAT**) or American College Test (**ACT**) scores to the Office of Admissions at OSU.
- **College Preparatory Subjects:**
English (4 years), Math (3 years),
Social Studies (3 years), Science (3 years)
- **Foreign Language:** 2 years of the same high school level foreign language, earning a grade of 'C-' or higher, **or** 2 quarters of the same college-level foreign language, or earning a satisfactory score on an approved assessment of foreign language knowledge.

Transfer DPP Admission Reqs.

1-23 quarter credit hours (1-15 semester hours)

GPA: 2.25+ transfer **AND** 3.0+ high school

Subjects: College level writing & math preferred, not required

24 + quarter hours (16 + semester hours)

GPA: 2.25 - 2.49 transfer

Subjects: College-level writing (WR 121, English Composition) and college-level math (Algebra: MTH 105 or 111) , c– grade or better

24 + quarter hours (16 + semester hours)

GPA: 2.50+ transfer

Subjects: College-level writing & math preferred, not required

*Same **foreign language** requirement for First Year*

Admission (unless graduated high school before spring 1997).

Residency

Rules determining who pays in-state tuition differ between OSU and partner schools.

- Students from border states (WA, ID, CA, NV) may pay in-district tuition at partner schools
- Policies to establish residency for out-of-state students vary at partner schools
- OSU's Ecampus does not charge non-resident rates

Oregon Promise

DPP is a great opportunity for Oregon Promise students to take advantage of what both community colleges and OSU have to offer.

- Oregon Promise does not cover OSU courses
- It covers 12 credits at the community college, so a good way to stay on track to graduate in four years is to pick up 1 class at OSU and lock into a catalog and connect with an advisor.

DPP and Financial Aid

OSU's financial aid office will count the credits at the partner school toward the total load, and will base the award off the total.

- 1 credit at OSU to receive aid
- 6 credits If student has OSU scholarships/grant
- OSU will issue you a refund check after subtracting your OSU tuition -- use this to pay your bill at the community college.

DPP and Billing

- Aid will pay out at ONE school
- Student's aid will pay for courses at home school first
- Student needs to pay partner school separately either with refund or personal funds
